Dear Friend in Christ,

Thank you for your generous contribution to the Hurricane Helene relief efforts of Boone United Methodist Church. Because you reached out in love to us, we were able to extend your kindness to many hurting people around our community.



The Monday after the storm, our congregation began feeding breakfast to individuals and families who could not prepare meals at home due to the loss of water and power that affected many in our area. For two weeks, our wonderful kitchen staff and volunteers provided breakfast in our Family Life Center for more than 200 people, offering an opportunity for food and fellowship, as well as comfort to one another after enduring the hardships of the hurricane. We also delivered dozens of meals out into the

community for people who could not easily access our facilities due to distance and road closures. As more households regained power and water, we wound down the dine-in aspect of our feeding ministry, but we continue to transport meals to communities with limited access to food and who are still without water.

Because of your giving, our Preschool pivoted to offer free childcare for parents of our first

responders, as well as for working parents needing a safe and caring place for their kids. With many day care centers and schools being closed for several weeks, this ministry was a godsend to families in our region. On most days, more than 120 preschool children were laughing, having fun, and experiencing the love of Jesus through the care offered by our dedicated staff and volunteers. To help children deal with the crisis, creative church members made more than 400 comfort bags for young ones around our community, including those attending our childcare ministry.



Though school is starting back, things are far from normal around here. In the surrounding area, there is much devastation, and it will take years to rebuild. Because of that, our church will continue to minister to those who are hurting in our region by providing scholarships for our preschool for families who lost much during the storm. We will continue to send out groups to

Our ongoing Firewood Ministry will increase its scope of delivering the sole source of heating for many in our region. As we are able, we will provide direct financial assistance to help people get back on their feet. Also, our church facility will be a place to house mission volunteers from places throughout the country.

Your support has been invaluable to us during this time of recovery from an unprecedented disaster. We invite you to continue to help us minister to those in

need through your prayers, your donations, and your volunteer service around our region. There will be plenty of work for a long time to come.
